
To be held at Eden Valley over the weekend of September 30 and October 1 2023, the Keyneton MCC, and the Trials South Australia community, are looking forward to welcoming and hosting riders, and their families and supporters, from all states of Australia, and from New Zealand and around the world.

Keyneton Motorcycle Club President, Mr Sean Heidenreich commented, "It's not only exciting and pleasing that we, as a sporting club, have been able to have a 20+ year relationship with the Vine Inn Barossa, but now to be, once again, welcoming all of our fellow Trial competitors from across the Tasman, and into 'Billy Jacks at the Vine' is just an awesome added bonus!"

FIM Oceania President Peter Doyle said, "FIM Oceania is very pleased to award the 2023 FIM Oceania Trial Championship to the Keyneton MCC. The location of the event is outstanding, and we know that the club will once again create a special event not to be missed. We look forward to seeing the best Trial competitors from the Oceania region battling it out for the FIM Oceania Trophy and adding their name as a FIM Oceania Champion."

And the word from 'across the ditch' is that the Kiwi riders are more than looking forward to coming back to South Australia to try and replicate the win they had there in 2017 and to try to regain the FIM Oceania Championship they lost at home in 2018. The last time the Championship was held was in 2018, so it will have been a long 5-year gap between Trans-Tasman battles.

Team line-ups for Team Australia and Team NZ will be announced in 2023, with teams to be made up of senior and junior riders, and male and female riders, who will not only showcase how exciting Trial is to watch, but also that it is a sport for all ages and genders.

Club trials

Club Champs – 20 November (setters: Jules, Guillaume Rhys, Ross, Shane, Steve, Tui; officials: Peter B, Jules)

The annual Pioneer club championship round was held at Purau Valley again this year. After the rain on Saturday, 23 riders and 4 minis put their trust in the met service forecast, which stayed true and provided a fine, dry day for riding.

The sections provided a challenge for all riders, with very few single figure scores. The features included several greasy banks, muddy bogs, technical cambers and slippery rocks within the creek.

In alignment with the recent club decision, the section setters included a dedicated orange and green route for those wanting a bit more of a challenge from the red and blue lines respectively.

Jules took out the overall expert orange route win, followed by Paul in 2nd and Tom in 3rd. In the red expert line, Glenn took the win followed by a tight battle between Simon in 2nd and Rhys in 3rd.

The yellow intermediate line was the most popular class of the day with 7 riders. Kahu had a great ride only losing 25 points, well ahead of the hotly contested 2nd- 6th positions. Ross took 2nd place followed by Hamish in 3rd.

The green line had one entry with Tui taking the win with an impressive lap 3 of zero points.

Christine took first in clubman A, with a very impressive 3 laps of zero points. The two Dave's (Davies and Chambers) took 2nd and 3rd respectively with only 2 points separating them.

Dick took the win in clubman B, ahead of Peter D in 2nd and a great ride from Isabel in 3rd having recently stepped up from Minis to the adult sections. Isabel showed great consistency for laps 2-4, where she was hot on the tail of Dick and Peter's scores.

The wet grass provided a challenge to the small wheels of the Mini classes. Bodie Harper took the win in the Mini A line, followed by Leo Hopkins in 2nd. Max Blanchard took the win in Mini B, with low scoring laps 2-4. Kobe won the Mini C class on his new Oset.

As always, thanks to the landowner, Richard Fisher, organisers of the event, and the section setters. Special thanks to Shane Hubbard for going the extra mile and traveling circa 2 hours each way to set the minis, whilst not able to ride the trial due to other commitments. **Tom Beedles**

Summer series round 1 – 11 December, Teddington (section setters: Derek, Shane B, officials: Derek, Patrick)

Round one for the Summer series! Exciting!

Recently agreed changes to slightly soften the red line, while introducing both Green and Orange lines, tempted me to start the series riding Red. A little voice in my head that sounded a little like Alan and little like Tui said "Work on your race craft, Arron" I was excited to see a few faces that I'd not seen at recent trials. Kendall is always good to watch. Glenn wasn't there but Kendall, Shane and Derek would leave me behind if I wasn't paying attention. So Yellow it would be! There was also a "new" guy at the trial, Mats. I had a sneaky suspicion he'd go all right. It'll be good to watch him battle with Jules at future trials.

I've never ridden this part of Teddington. It's always exciting to ride somewhere new! We weren't starting with that big flat rock on the first section, so nothing to worry about. Except there was.

The first section had a very steep more than head-high bank to climb up. Upon arriving at the top it was only a bike length before riding down a very narrow sheep track on the side of the bank. There was a rock sticking out just begging to grab a foot peg and make you

high-side and fall 2 m to the hard track below. Tui gave us a scare by riding his bike in a nice controlled fashion to the top of the climb and then throwing it back down the bank. He stayed on his feet at the top. It seems Teddington always starts with something intimidating.

On section three I scared myself half to death as I almost tucked the front wheel under the bike while trying to recover from a bad line. My hip hit the handlebar and I frantically pointed the bike down the bank to avoid high-siding. I assumed I'd ridden out of the section and fived, but when I got to the end both Ashley and Shane assured me that I'd finished with only two dabs. Of course, they had to finish laughing before they could communicate.

Section five cost me a five on the first lap as I accidentally rode outside a marker. I knew it was there somewhere, but I couldn't see it so guessed and got it wrong. This had an intimidating rock at the beginning. I got over the rock clean on last lap which was very satisfying but this section still cost me one or two of the three points on my final lap. Section 8 was a challenge all day. When we got there Kendall said he'd lost his first points for the day, but it was 5. I think my best in this section was a one on the last lap, but I managed to avoid five-ing it all day. I know it caught a few people.

Next up was one of my favourite "Sections". The grass track between 8 and 9 where I could pretend I was a Motocross pro

Section nine also cost me a five on the first lap as I accidentally lent my handlebars on a rock. I got out with one's or cleans for the rest of the day.

10 was tricky but I surprised myself by cleaning it all day. Partly thanks to watching Shane do it first.

After the first lap, I got my act together and didn't do anything especially stupid for the rest of the day. No more fives at least. I hadn't been thinking about scores all day, just focusing on trying to do all the little bits better than the last lap and it turns out that was good enough for the Yellow class win!
